# **Accomplishment Report 2020**

#### INTRODUCTION

The Carlos Hilado Memorial State College-Fortune Towne Campus Library is committed to a user-centered approach in all aspects of its programs and services. Based on its five-year strategic plan, its focus is on promoting intellectual growth and creativity by developing collections, facilitating access to information resources, teaching the effective use of information resources and critical evaluation skills, and offering research assistance.

The year 2020 was a challenge to the College Library as a result of COVID-19 pandemic wherein face-to-face classes were suspended and quarantine protocols were implemented. It is during that time that Librarians and Library Staff developed strategies and new services in order to continue its library services delivery to its library users especially the students.

This Accomplishment Report highlights the significant achievements for Calendar Year 2020 that despite the pandemic, the library continues its support and delivery of quality service to CBMA students, faculty, staff, Administrators, and even to its community.

#### **ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

The College Library was able to acquire 445 titles and 766 volumes of books through purchase and donations. There is an increase in the books acquisition compared to 2019 Acquisition Report.





#### **Online Learning Library Assistance**

The Online Learning Library Assistance (OLLA) was the newest service of the CHMSC-FT Library formally launched in May 27, 2020. Olla is the Virtual Reference Assitant that may reach through Facebook page created to assist in the research works of CHMSC-FT library users.




Figure 1. Summary of Online Learning Library Assistance Report by Users

Figure 1 presents the summary of Online Learning Library Assistance Report by users



from May-December 2020. The data shows that the users that belong to the Top 3 with the highest frequency of Online Learning Library Assistance were from BS in Management Accounting with 79, BS in Business Administration with 67, and MBA with 62. Furthermore, the data indicates that the newest library service had reached the library users and found it useful as face-to-face transactions had been suspended and it also prove that the library remains relevant to its library users.

# **Online Document Delivery**

In the suspension of face-to-face transactions due to COVID-19 pandemic, many library users had turned to the library's document delivery service. Library users may request for e-book or request for scanning of print materials subject to fair use.




Figure 2. Frequency on Document Delivery by Users

Figure 2 presents the Frequency on Document Delivery by Users from May-December 2020. The data shows that MBA tops on the Document Delivery with 108 frequencies, followed by BS in Management Accounting with 77 frequencies and BS in Business Administration with 65. Furthermore, it implies that those pursuing their master's degree has higher demands on their research and information needs compare to the undergraduate. It also signifies that Online Document Delivery Service is very relevant especially in this time of a pandemic.

Table 1 presents the Summary of Borrowing Transactions of the Library Users from January-March 2020. The data shows that there were 2,982 customers availed the Circulation Services in the duration of three months before the pandemic. Students of BS in Accountancy tops among the library customers who availed the Circulation Services with 1,128 in frequency. They were followed by BS in Management Accounting with 455 in frequency and Faculty with 419. Furthermore, it also revealed that in March there was a sudden drop of borrowing transactions which is obviously caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.




Figure 3. Borrowing Transactions Report of Students by Purpose

As presented in Figure 3, the data revealed that majority of Graduate and Undergraduate Students preferred to borrow books for research while majority of the Faculty chose to borrow books for overnight use. This entails that most of the students preferred to study and do their research in the library.

# **Photocopy Services**




Figure 4. Photocopy Services Utilization

A total of 574 library users availed the Photocopy Services from January to March 2020. As shown in Figure 4, Outside Researchers are the top users who availed the Photocopy Services. As to the students, BS in Accountancy, BS in Information Systems, and BS in Management Accounting are the Top 3 programs that availed the service.

# **Printing Services**




Figure 5. Printing Services Utilization

A total of 1,047 library users availed the Printing Services from January to March 2020. As shown in Figure 5, students of BS in Information Systems tops among the library users who availed the Printing Services with 365 in frequency. They were followed by BS in Business Administration with 213 frequencies and BS in Management Accounting with 117.

#### **Internet and Computer-Aided Research Services**




Figure 6. Internet and Computer-Aided Research Services Utilization

A total of 9,326 library users availed the Services from January to March 2020 to access online information through Internet, WIFI and Mobile Learning to comply with their research requirements. As shown in Figure 6, among the Internet and Computer-Aided Research Services, Internet Research got the highest utilization with 4,302 frequency.




Figure 7. Internet Research Services Utilization

Specifically, a total of 4,905 library users availed the Internet Services for their research from January to March 2020. As presented in Figure 7, BS in Information Systems has the highest utilization of the service among the library users with 1,485 frequency. It is followed by BS in Management Accounting with 956 and BS in Business Administration with 775 frequency. This entails the high demands of students in accessing information through the internet.




Figure 8. WIFI Utilization

Moreover, Figure 8 presents the WIFI Utilization Report. The data revealed that among the library users, BS in Information Systems, BS in Business Administration, and BS in Management Accounting are the Top 3 programs with the highest utilization of the WIFI services with the frequency of 1,367; 797; and 778 respectively. This entails the consistency in the report that the said three programs have the high demands as to the connectivity to the internet. Furthermore, these students found the service useful for fast way in accessing information they need.




Figure 9. Mobile Learning Services Utilization

Figure 9 presents the Mobile Learning Services Utilization. The data shows that for January to March 2020, there were 119 library users who availed the Mobile Learning Services. Among the library users, BS in Management Accounting, BS in Business Administration, and BS in Accountancy were the top programs when it comes to the utilization of the said service. BS in Management Accounting has 49 in frequency, BS in Business Administration has 24, and BS in Accountancy has 19. This proves that Mobile Learning Services attracts the students in doing their research in the library.

# **Library User Admission**

Table 2 presents the Library User Admission Report by Type of Users from January-March 2020. The data shows that the College Library was able to serve 26,565 customers in CY 2020. Furthermore, BS in Accountancy tops among the library users who frequently entered the Library with 6,327 frequencies. BS in Management Accounting followed with 5,452 frequencies and BS in Information Systems with 4,822. The data also revealed that January has the most numbered library user admission.




#### **CHED NQAT**





The College Library conducted an orientation to its new student assistants on January 29, 2020.


